

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




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Christmas



We awoke refreshed in Colonia and we set off walking to the old town. It was very picturesque and quaint, built by the Spanish and Portuguese before Montevideo. Given the town's strategic position it was fought over many times with the British and Brazilians trying to take the place. It provided a port, together with Buenos Aires where silver from Potosi in Bolivia could be shipped to Europe. The old town was made of small granite sets a bit like in Portugal, but the streets of the new town were just as difficult to walk on.

We left Colonia in a little hire car; it had only done 30,000km but had dodgy а clutch. We



stayed the night at a wine lodge as my birthday treat to Chris, an overnight stay and a parrilla and it was very much the plushest place of the trip. It was called El Legado. The setting was stunning and so peaceful; It was a family run business and they only made 3,000 bottles of wine per year. We had an hour to get sorted and went over to the bodega at 4pm. They made 4 wines, a white Viognier, reds Syrah, Tannat and a blend of Syrah and Tannat. The tasting was accompanied by small dishes to have with each type of wine. The parrilla was two types of steak, two types of fat Toulouse style sausages with sweet potato and roasted vegetables. We were then shown how to siphon wine out of the barrel into the glass.

We had a quick tour of where the wine is made, a small building although not anything like as detailed as other tours we had done. It was all very chilled and laid back, much like the country and the people. Dessert was ice cream with a Tannat reductionlip smackingly good. We returned

to our room and our neighbours were drinking on the terrace, so we had wine and chatted with two nice American couples.

A very wet and windy night made the next day feel much fresher. Breakfast w а S



delivered to your room in a box, although nothing special. We paid the bill and Chris offered to pay the bill for the two bottles of wine we had drunk in our room. He nearly fell over - it was 56\$, it was then we should have realised the addition of the word boutique adds more money, but it was his 70th birthday present. Still, it was a very different experience, in a beautiful place and the staff were very good.

Our next and final stay was at Villa Soriana. In 1624, a Franciscan Mission established a village for the indigenous tribes of the area named Santo Domingo de Soriano. It constituted the first permanent European settlement on Uruguayan soil, predating the foundation of Colonia by more than fifty years. Our Airbnb host was Sophie, an interesting French woman who had bought a boat with an inheritance, sailed around in it for 10 years then sailed from Toulon across the Atlantic to Buenos Aires. She sailed up the river estuary and moored at Villa Soriana, fell in love with the place, sold the boat and bought the house.

There were two external terraces and a huge garden and my favourite space was a small arch completely covered in foliage, always cool and peaceful. The garden was full of birds with hummingbirds on the hibiscus and parakeets squawking in the tall trees.

had read about а place to eat called Como en Casa, (translated 'eat like at home') and we thought we would eat on Sunday evening. We went to book for Sunday only to find they were only open in the daytime, we decided so to eat that evening. I had delicious home-

made cannelloni (lots of Italian influences in Uruguay) and Chris had a Milanese, a beef escalope. It was exactly as it said, nicely cooked food and Maria the owner was so happy to see us.

On Sunday we headed further north to Mercedes, place а with а huge river frontage. Everyone was driving



slowly so after we parked up I asked someone why and he explained that the speed limit was 30kph and it was Sunday so people just cruise along. We watched as they parked up got out their folding chairs and sat drinking and chatting, all very civilised. There is even a Spanish verb 'matear', which means to meet up and drink mate.

Back in town in the evening there was a small food van with chairs and tables. Sat at the next table were four people and the owner, Maria, brought them some round, flat golden things. They were tortas fritas, like a flat savoury

doughnut, very yummy. One of the four people was not a native Spanish speaker, but he had spotted Chris's **'Help for Heroes'** band. He was Dave, ex-military retired on sick grounds, who was travelling round South America with his Colombian wife Monica. They were travelling in a tuk tuk and also had a boat in Scotland, but are now sailing the coast of the UK- the wonders of Instagram.

On our last day we spent a relaxing time just chilling, enjoyed a walk around town, popped to the bakers and had a bit of lunch. We sometimes enjoy these hanging out days more than legging it round museums etc. The car went back and we got the bus back to **Montevideo**, stayed overnight and flew to Santiago via Buenos Aires to overnight near the airport. Next day we left **Santiago** at 12.20pm and arrived in **Madrid**

at 6am Friday morning. Then the train to **Murcia**, bus to **Mula** and lift back home to **Casas Nuevas**.

Highlights and reflections

Let's start with the elephant in the room, we went to see blue whales and sadly it wasn't to be. Chris did see minke and humpbacks on his Antarctic cruise. He absolutely loved the whole wildlife experience, the stunning scenery and the experts on the ship. He didn't come back a cruise convert and enjoyed our time in a grubby town in **Uruguay** but with a relaxed vibe, great river views and super friendly people.

My overriding memories of **Uruguay** will be very friendly people wandering around with a flask in one hand and a mate cup and bombilla in the other. We have only seen a tiny part of the southwest and nothing of

Montevideo where nearly half the population live. I'm not sure it's worth a longer visit, especially as it is one of the more expensive South American countries.

Argentina was hard work in the heat and with hindsight I should have spent less time in **Buenos Aires.** A Polish lady I met said "why come to Buenos Aires to see European style buildings when there are so many better examples in Europe "She did have a point!

Chile seemed like a lifetime ago, but Chiloe Island was fascinating and Raul Marin a hidden gem. Vanessa and her mum Nancy are two of the most genuine and nicest people we have met on our travels.

Where next? Planning has started on a February 2024 trip to Sri Lanka-there are blue whales off Mirissa !

The Development of La Manga Del Mar Menor

La Manga is located to the east of San Javier, roughly 50km to the southeast of Murcia City and consists of a long spit of land which separates the Mar Menor (Minor Sea) from the Mediterranean Sea (the Mar Mayor). This strip is 21km long and – on average – 100m wide and runs from Cabo de Palos in the south to the settlement of San Pedro del Pinatar in the north. 'The Strip' which ultimately became known as La Manga was formed over a period of 10,000,000 years or so, by a combination of volcanic eruptions under the seabed and the depositing of sediments from rivers which ran through the Campo de Cartagena. Originally, the strip was composed of distinct islands, but the build-up of river sediment, combined with the effect of wind, sea currents and tides led, over time, to the formation of a continuous, narrow stretch of land, breached at intervals by narrow channels or golas.

La Manga del Mar Menor has a very long history indeed, stretching back to at least Neolithic times. Clay and mud huts from this era have been discovered in the area, along with the remains of small

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wooden cottages. The rich fishing grounds in the area, a long with its extensive mineral

deposits, also attracted other ancient civilisations. Phoenicians, Greeks, Carthaginians and Romans all made their presence felt in the area and ancient boats containing cargoes of gold and silver have been found at the bottom of the **Mar Menor.** The Romans referred to **La Manga** area as Palos, while the Moors later called it Al Buhayrat Al Qsarand.

During the sixteenth century, when Spanish power was at its absolute height, **La Manga** area (and the Mediterranean as a whole) was in the frontline of an epic series of battles between the Spanish on one side and Ottoman Turks and North African Barbary pirates on the other.

Carlos I, King of Spain and Holy Roman Emperor, ordered the building of the circular Torre de San Miguel, at El Estacio, as a defence against pirate attack. Also, in 1571, Philippe II gave the go-ahead for the building of Torre de la Encanizada to defend La Manga headland from Turkish and Barbary pirate attacks. Although the Spanish monarchy tried to protect the area from plundering by pirates, very little was done to develop the Mar Menor. It remained largely undeveloped though during the eighteenth century - La Manga spit of land and the areas immediately to the north and south, were increasingly denuded of trees as a result of strong prevailing winds and the removal of timber for firewood and other commercial products.

Until the mid-nineteenth century, the situation in **La Manga** remained largely static. The By Adrian & Dawn Leyland Bridge dalbridge21@outlook.com

region was the property of the crown, but in 1863 it passed into private hands as the result of a public auction. The Spanish crown relinquished its property rights in **La Manga** for 31,000 Reales – the equivalent of about 46€ in modern money.

By the end of the nineteenth century, t h e southern end of La M a n g a strip was under the ownership

of Jose Huertas, who had then passed on his rights of ownership to the mining magnate Francisco Celdran. The northern part of the spit was swallowed up by the Maestre family and by the 1950s Tomas Maestre Zapata owned the entire area.

In 1956, Zapata's nephew, Tomas Maestra Azner acquired total rights over these northern La Manga lands. Subsequently, he also bought out Celdran's land in the south and thereby became the sole master of the whole of **La Manga.** From this point onwards, Azner was able to push ahead with his plans to turn **La Manga** into an internationally known tourist centre.

The first La Manga urbanisation project was launched in 1961 under the auspices of the architect Antonio Bonet Castellano. Of course, the Franco dictatorship was fully in control of Spain during this period and central government permission was needed before La Manga's transformation into an international tourist destination could begin. This national government approval was secured in 1962 when Franco's Minister of Tourism, Manuel Fraga Iribarne, gave the final go-ahead for La


The first phase of the great **La Manga** project was launched in the year 1963-4



from The Strip

when construction of the central Gran Via road artery, along with adjacent roads and buildings actually began. The second phase of the project began in 1964-5 and after these initial bursts of construction activity had taken place, **La Manga** began to take on the shape it has today.

During the initial planning stages of midthe 1960s it was envisaged that La Manga would



of The Strip

be developed at its northern and southern tips, while the middle of 'The Strip' remained an undeveloped, natural area. These desires failed to survive the economic difficulties of the 1970s when land in the central areas of the La Manga spit was hurriedly sold off to a range of private developers, who subsequently built hotels, apartments and other high-rise commercial edifices which were more closely packed than ever before. As a consequence, the modern La Manga strip as it exists today, in 2023, was finally born – a modern, urban tourist Mecca popular with people from around the world. (Adrian & Dawn L. NEWS

I just typed DECEMBER! -----Where has this year gone?

Before I forget, we would like to wish a very Happy **Christmas** and New Year to all our past, present and future clients.

Regular readers will know we at **RAINBOW SATELLITES** actively support the local charity **'Friends of Mazarron Animals'** - a successful and active local registered **charity** that helps any animal in need including taking as many as possible from the local perrera (animal pound) that circumstances will allow.

If you can give an animal, generally a dog, a foster home please contact FMA - we can always, eventually, find any animal a permanent home but it is the time between taking them under our wing and finding that permanent home which is always difficult. Fostering is difficult sending a dog on its way after you have had it for a while can be heartbreaking but we all do it with the knowledge that we have started the animal on its way and we now have room to get another on its way.

TV NEWS – The Freesat satellite signals are back in their stronger winter modes and some channels lost in the summer may now be back – however they will be gone again next spring. Dish/LNB adjustments will not get these channels back – it is about the strength of the actual signal.

Many of you still watch UK TV on satellite with some channels unavailable and this arrangement should last through 2024 but we expect the demise soon after. Then the only way to watch UK TV in southern Spain will be through the internet. There are many ways to do this from a firestick/android type self managed device and can be free, to a semi managed similar device with a fee, to the fully managed professional IPTV system – similar to **Rainbow Satellites** system.

One rarely talked about problem is the security of all systems to your home internet/computer systems. Firesticks, Androids and the like have very little security and it would be very easy for your APP provider to hack into your home computer system - it has been done. Be careful of systems and APPS from the market stall or from an unknown provider – cheap they may be, but if you experience a hack that could range from being an inconvenience to accessing your bank account! Unfortunately there are thousands of people out there who do nothing but try to access your personal/ bank details. They only need one successful "hit" a month to make a "living" and they try thousands a day. Would you book your airline tickets through a company that pops up on the internet offering 5€ tickets to anywhere? We hope not and equally, for the same reasons, don't get your TV from some cheap unknown APP or provider. Remember that most internet TV providers are just middle men purely selling the product from some often unknown supplier in some third world country - you have been warned. Instead, use a well known legal and established supplier who uses security conscious MAG type boxes from known sources. No they will not be the cheapest, but will be the safest.

If you have never used internet TV before or have had a bad experience in the past we at **Rainbow** offer a free no obligation in home demonstration and the loan of a box for up to a week so that you can fully assess the system before you actually buy it. You will need good stable internet

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with a speed of over 12mbs and ideally the router adjacent to the TV. Most internet suppliers are now good enough - they all see IPTV as the way forward for TV watching and they have to provide decent internet to survive - try us for a week with nothing to lose and no hard sell; if you don't like what we offer or think the time is not yet right for you to move to IPTV, not a problem - we just come and remove the equipment. You can always try again in the future if you find you 're no longer receiving the channels you'd like to satisfactorily.

On the subject of internet, no one in this life of ours is perfect and internet suppliers do have problems - fibre was described as the "perfect internet solution" but I liken it to CD's/DVD's remember they were perfect sound and picture and unable to be destroyed - well we all know that is not the case! Fibre is good but it does have problems at times - just remember for good TV viewing you need both a decent IPTV system and internet supply which unfortunately usually involves two companies - then who do you complain to when things are bad? They both often say "it's not us" However, there are ways to prove conclusively who is at fault but each situation needs looking at individually. We at **Rainbow** are always open to discuss and help resolve problems.

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Christmas Recipes

Easy turkey crown



50g butter, softened 2kg turkey crown on the bone 1 tsp Chinese five spice or a pinch of ground cloves

For the glaze 4 tbsp honey 1 tbsp Dijon mustard 1 tbsp red wine vinegar

Heat oven to 190C/170C fan/gas 5. Smear the butter all over the turkey crown and season with salt and half the five spice. Put in a roasting tin, skin-side up, and roast for 30 mins. While the crown is roasting, mix all the glaze ingredients in a bowl with the rest of the five spice.

Remove the crown from the oven and brush the skin generously with half the glaze. Continue to roast for another hour, glazing twice more, until cooked all the way through and the glaze is sticky and caramelised. Leave to rest for at least 20 mins before carving. Save the juices from the tin to make gravy.

Baked camembert with brioche bun wreath



1 camembert (about 250g) in a wooden box 50g panko breadcrumbs 1 tsp fresh thyme leaves 7 fresh bay leaves, to serve (optional) cranberry sauce or chilli jam, to serve

For the brioche buns



600g strong white bread flour, plus extra for dusting 7g sachet fast-action dried yeast 2 tsp golden caster sugar 3 eggs, lightly beaten 200ml milk, warmed 150g butter, softened

First, make the brioche dough. Put the flour, yeast, sugar and 2 tsp salt into the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with a dough hook. Pour 2 tbsp of the beaten egg into a small bowl and set aside. Tip the rest of the egg into the mixer bowl along with the warmed milk. Mix on a medium speed until the mixture comes together to form a dough, then carry on mixing for 5 mins on a medium speed, or until springy and glossy.

With the machine still running, add the butter, a small piece at a time, until fully incorporated, about 8-10 mins. At first it will look like it's not coming together, but keep working the dough, scraping down the sides of the mixing bowl as you go. Once all the butter has been worked in, carry on mixing for a minute or two until smooth. Form into a ball and cover the bowl with a tea towel. Leave for about an hour until doubled in size.

Tip the dough out onto a floured surface and knead to knock out the air, then divide into 24 equal pieces, roughly weighing 45g each, and roll each into a ball. Take the cheese out of the box, set aside and put the empty box in the middle of a large baking tray lined with baking parchment. Arrange a ring of 8-10 dough balls around the box, then another ring of balls around that one, fitting them into the gaps. Leave to prove in a warm place for 30 mins or chill for a few hours.

Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Brush the dough balls with the reserved beaten egg,

sprinkle with salt and use a pair of scissors to make a snip in the top of each one to give them a spiked effect. Unwrap the cheese and return to the wooden box. Sprinkle over the breadcrumbs and thyme leaves, and bake for 25-30 mins until the dough balls are golden brown. Leave to cool for 5 mins, then scatter over the bay leaves, if using, and serve with cranberry sauce or chilli jam.

Truffle & parmesan roast potatoes



1½ kg Maris Piper or King Edward potatoes, peeled and cut into 5cm chunks 2 tbsp plain flour 200ml vegetable oil 50g parmesan or vegetarian hard cheese, finely grated

truffle oil, to taste

Bring a large pan of salted water to the boil and cook the potatoes for 6-8 mins until the outsides are starting to soften. Drain well, then leave to steam-dry for a few minutes. (They will keep covered and chilled for up to two days). Return the potatoes to the pan, add the flour, put the lid on and shake well to coat the potatoes and fluff them up. Meanwhile, heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Pour the oil into a deep roasting tin and put in the oven to heat for 5 mins. Take out of the oven and carefully spoon the potatoes into the hot oil, then baste in the oil so they're well coated. Spread them out to a single layer and put in the oven to roast for 20 mins. Turn and baste again, roast for another 20 mins, then repeat and roast for a final 15-20 mins or until golden and crisp. Scatter over all but a couple of tablespoonfuls of the parmesan, then put back in the oven for 2 mins so the cheese melts.

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Remove the potatoes from the tin, leaving as much oil behind as possible, and pile onto a platter or on a serving dish. Scatter over the remaining parmesan, give the platter or bowl a shake, then drizzle over a little truffle oil (we used ½ tsp, but use as much as you like).

Cranberry spritz



100ml cranberry juice ¹/₂ orange, juiced 6 sage leaves around 4 ice cubes 80ml sparkling white grape juice Pour 50ml cranberry juice into two champagne coups or wine glasses. Divide the orange juice between them, then stir.

Add 3 sage leaves and an ice cube or two to each glass, then top up with the sparkling grape juice.

No-cook meringue Christmas tree



2 meringue nests Whipped cream 36 mini meringues

To decorate

Melted white chocolate or white chocolate stars

Peppermint candy canes, broken up (optional)

Berry compote, to serve (optional)

This simplified version of our magical meringue tree uses shopbought meringues assembled in a tree shape, then decorated. Stack the meringue nests, sandwiching them together with whipped cream. Use the mini meringues to build a tree shape around the stacked nests, sticking them on using more whipped cream. Decorate with melted white chocolate or white chocolate stars and broken-up peppermint candy canes, if you like, or serve with a berry compote.

Discovering truth and prayer (Part 2)

Did you know that there is a relationship between **truth and prayer**? Last month, time was taken to look at what is truth and where it comes from. In 2nd Peter chapter 1 and verse 21 it says "For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man, but holy men of **God** spake as they were moved by the Holy Spirit".

The holy spirit is a gift from Yehovah (Jehovah or God) which convicts us of sin, righteousness and the judgement. It also teaches and guides us into all truth. John chapter 16 and verses 8 and 13 states "And when the holy spirit of truth comes, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of the judgement. When the holy spirit of truth shall come, he will guide you into all truth, for he shall not speak of himself, but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak and he will show you things to come". In other words accept Yehovah's (Jehovah or God) Scripture for it reveals truth. What does the Scripture have to say about prayer.

What is Prayer? This is a valid question which must be answered. Prayer is the means by which one communicates with Yehovah (Jehovah), the God of all Creation. Prayer is essential to the Christian and its purpose is noted in Ephesians chapter 3 and verses 16 to 19 "That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man, that Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith. Being rooted and grounded in love may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth, and length, and depth, and height, and to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be filled with all the fulness of God".

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Yeshua (**Jesus**) gave his disciples instructions about prayer. In Luke chapter 11 and verses 1 to 4 it states "It came to pass, that, as he was praying in a certain place, when he ceased, one of his disciples said unto him, Lord, teach us to pray...He said unto them when ye pray, say Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, as in heaven, so in earth. Give us day by day our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone that is indebted to us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil". According to 2nd Chronicles chapter 7 and verse 14 it says "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land". This indicates that the sincere and sanctified praver will be heard and answered.

Yeshua always prayed, for in Mark chapter 1 and verse 35 it declares "In the morning, rising up a great while before day, he went out, and departed into a solitary place and prayed there". Also in Luke chapter 6 and verse 12 it confirms this point "And it came to pass in those days, that he went out into a mountain to pray, and continued all night in **prayer** to **God**".

Prayer and Truth can not be separated. Yehovah (Jehovah or God) wants his followers to worship him in spirit and in truth. This is evident in John chapter 4 and verses 23 and 24 where it explains clearly "But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth, for the Father seeketh such to worship him. **God** is Spirit and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth". What is truth? The Scripture states that the words contained in it is truth. The answer to this is found in John

chapter 17 and verse 17 "Sanctify them through thy truth. Thy word is truth".

There is a warning in the book of Proverbs chapter 28 and verse 9, 10 and 13, which outlines "He that turneth away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer shall be an abomination. Whoso causeth the righteous to go astray in an evil way, he shall fall himself into his own pit, but the upright shall have good things in possession. He that covereth his sins shall not prosper. But whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy".

Throughout the Old and New Testament there is much reference to **prayer.** In 1st Kings chapter 8 and verse 45 it states "Then hear thou in heaven their prayer and their supplication, and maintain their cause". (This same passage is repeated in 2nd Chronicles chapter 6 and verse 35). King David prayed often and in Psalms chapter 5 and verse 3 he declares "My voice shalt thou hear in the morning, O LORD, in the morning will I direct my **prayer** unto thee, and will look up".

Also, in Psalms chapter 6 and verse 9 it says "The LORD hath heard my supplication, the LORD will receive my prayer". Psalms chapter 66 and verses 16 to 20 shows answered prayers "Come and hear, all ye that fear **God**, and I will declare what he hath done for my soul. I cried unto him with my mouth, and he was extolled with my tongue. If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me. But verily God has heard me and has attended to the voice of my prayer. Blessed be **God**, which hath not turned away my prayer, nor his mercy from me".

Everyone knows that there is much evil in the world today, but what is the answer? The followers of the Scriptures know that prayer

is needed. In Daniel chapter 9 and verse 13 it explains "As it is written in the law of Moses, all this evil is come upon us, yet made we not our prayer before the LORD our **God**, that we might turn from our iniquities and understand thy truth". (the law of Moses refers to the first 5 books of the Old Testament. These 5 books are called the Torah in Hebrew. Torah simply means law or instructions). As prayer is closely related to a knowledge of truth, in Mathew chapter 21 and verse 22 there is a promise "And all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive".

If his followers live a surrendered life to him, there is a peace that comes with **prayer**. In 1st John chapter 5 and verses 14 and 15 it states "This is the confidence that we have in him that, if we ask anything according to his will, he heareth us. If we know that he hears us, whatsoever we ask, we know that we have the petition that we desired of him".

Get New Teeth In One Day Among the tools used by dentists for the rehabilitation of patients with very deteriorated mouths; those who either have no remaining teeth, or they are about to become edentulous patients due to the very poor state of their mouths, there is an option among the great

sources of conventional dental

treatments, called All-on-4®.

This kind of treatment was described by Dr Paulo Maló 20 years ago and, since its beginnings, it has been used to treat edentulous or potentially edentulous patients, due to the fact that it is a simple and economical option in comparison to other treatments involving dental implants.





Expat in Mazarron

Our November outing was a visit to Sierra Espuna which can be seen from Camposol in the distance. We were heading to the top of the mountain near the radar station, about a 50 minute drive. The road up can be a bit scary, but has amazing views. Whilst driving up you pass two view points where you can park and admire the view.

When we left Camposol the temperature was 21c, when we arrived at the car park it was 11c. So make sure you take warm clothing and water with you. Part of the group live in Alhama de Murcia, so we arranged to meet at the car park, but managed to get split for a while before meeting at the the snow wells.

What are the Snow Wells (also known as Snow Pits)?

Before refrigerators, ice was very important to keep food fresh. On the Sierra Espuña, there are 28 snow wells dotted about which were used to gather the snow and pack it in the wells. Mostly local gypsies would live near the wells (Los Pozos de la Nieve). The wells were built between the 16^{th} & 19^{th} century, providing the nearby towns and cities. When refrigerators were invented early 20th century, the work got less and less and also the climate changed with less snow. We then drove to the Visitors Centre to visit 'The Plane Building', which is a short walk from the

car park. The building was built for the Spanish Air Force, a resting place, like a summer camp, but it was never completed due to the outbreak of the Spanish Civil war (1936). It was going to be built in the shape of an aeroplane with a swimming pool in the middle as its main feature, but a few years ago (2021) reconstruction work took the aeroplane shape and the swimming pool is now the picnic area. There are two view points there

We then returned to the Visitors Centre and had a look around the museum which is free to view and it tells the story about the Sierra Espuña. It's a lovely building, built in the 1930's to house the forest

workers, partially damaged during the Spanish Civil War and rebuilt again. It also has



covered area for parking, electric points to charge cars and plenty of information boards showing where to walk or bike. Also you will find a lovely picnic area where we all had our lunch before returning home.

Next month, Camposol **Explorers** are going to explore water wheels along river the



Segura and on to a view point looking over the town of Cieza.

Jane Cronin's Step by Step Spanish

More People Words

We opened up the whole new subject of 'people words' last week and I have to say that ever since then I have come across more and more of them in everyday situations.

We started with people words ending in 'dor' and 'dora', and to extend the subject I thought we could look at ones that end in the suffix '-ante' or '-ente'. Again these are usually formed from verbs. For example, the verb 'cooperar' unsurprisingly means to 'cooperate'. The person word that comes from it 'cooperante' has a very specific meaning, which is 'aid worker'. There have been some rather nasty instances in the news recently of 'cooperantes' being kidnapped or suffering accidents. A very famous Spanish 'cooperante' in India, Vicente Ferrer was one of these who died and there has been much publicity about his life and work.

Similar in a way is the word **'ayudante'** which means **'helper'** from the verb **'ayudar'**. Sometimes you might see an advertisement for an 'ayudante de cocina' – a kitchen assistant. Formed in the same way, but with a different ending is the word 'oyente'. We are 'oyentes' when we listen to the radio, as we are people who listen or 'hear' from the verb 'oír'. Also with the 'ente' ending is 'creyente' (a believer) from the verb 'to believe' (creer).

These endings do not differentiate between masculine and feminine, but we would change the article (el, la, un, una) to mark the difference.

Another typical person ending is 'ero' or the feminine form 'era'. Someone who travels (viajar) is a 'viajero' or 'viajera'. Here's one that has been taken from English and preserves the typical Enalish spelling `rockero/ **rockera'** (a rock singer or rock star). Somehow these days the word goes with 'viejo' (old rocker) which is rather sad, I think! 'Viejo rockero' is also the title of a rather ironic song about this much loved and familiar character.

This takes me rather neatly on to a related topic, which is how we can turn adjectives into nouns that describe people. '**Viejo'** for example is an adjective as we have just seen in 'viejo rockero'. We can also say '**viejo amigo'** which is different incidentally from '**amigo viejo'.** 'Viejo amigo' is someone who has been your friend for a long time, whilst 'amigo viejo' is a friend who is old.

Anyway, back to the point, we can also use the word 'viejo' on its own as a noun. **'El viejo'** therefore means the 'old man' and **'la vieja'** the old woman. **'La vieja'** is not the most flattering thing to call someone – much more polite is **'la señora mayor'.**

The same system works for **'joven'** (young). 'El joven' (the young man) and **'la joven'** (the young woman).

Another example which comes to mind for some reason is the comedy pair Laurel and Hardy (yes, I really am that old as well). In Spanish they are called **'El Gordo y El Flaco'** (the fat one and the skinny one) which rather speaks for itself.

And finally, also connected to the world of cinema, that wonderful film entitled **'El bueno, el malo y el feo',** which when you translate it back to English shows that we occasionally do the same thing in our language as well.

Google has just told me that that film was released in the US in 1967. iCómo vuela el tiempo!






Hello everyone, can it really be December already?

For obvious reasons, t h e volunteers of **B Clean** gave up trying to



tidy the waste area some time ago as it was not their job and the risk factor was increasing. Volunteers have been undertaking the somewhat safer task of pruning the oleander hedges on the main roads of the sector and this, at least, has helped to improve the appearance of our urbanisation.

The group also has o t h e r projects in hand but they can only be a chieved w i t h volunteers
